

Coronavirus Scam Warning

Watch out for these fake Tesco emails

Action Fraud has received 30 reports about fake emails that purport to be from Tesco. The email states the supermarket is offering free vouchers during the coronavirus outbreak. The link in the email leads to a genuine-looking phishing website that is designed to steal your login credentials as well as personal and financial information.

Don't click on the links or attachments in suspicious emails and never respond to messages that ask for your personal or financial details.

Helping in your Community? Promote fact checking

There are false stories designed to scare people or provoke panic.

These include made up stories around the cause of the virus and articles about the virus being the end of the world. Although they can on the surface appear harmless they can increase anxiety, cause an upsurge in intolerance towards some minority groups, and lead to harassment or racist behaviour.

You can help counter this by suggesting that people use a fact checking website. There are many websites where you can check whether something you've seen online is real eg **fullfact.org**. You must never share medical advice, or offer medical opinions. A short hint is to encourage people to '**THINK**'.

TIPS TO PROTECT YOU AND THOSE YOU'RE HELPING

shopping for others

There are many people in our communities who aren't able to get out to the shops, or to get their medication, and it's really important that people like you are there to help them. Here are some tips that you will need to consider when shopping for others:

agree a maximum budget

When you're agreeing to shop for someone please discuss their budget, and agree a maximum amount that you will spend. Ideally don't make purchases larger than £30 for any one person.

purchase the items before asking for payment

It's best to purchase the items yourself, and then to show a receipt before asking for money from people in self-isolation.

never accept their credit/ debit cards

Please do not ever accept credit/debit

cards from those asking for help. If the person you're helping can't get access to any cash, please consider helping them explore other options such as home delivery.

look after personal information

Be extremely careful with any personal information which is shared with you or which you encourage others to share about themselves. This includes:

keeping information confidential

Through your support you may find out personal details, or a person's vulnerability might be shared with you when you're given tasks. It's vital that you keep that information confidential.



not recommending methods that may highlight a person's vulnerability publicly

Some community groups are using methods such as red and green cards in windows. A red card signals that someone needs help or assistance. Although these are well intentioned they can advertise a person's vulnerability to anyone who passes. We therefore do not recommend that these are used.

Kent Together - HELPLINE Launched by Kent County Council

A 24 hour helpline has been set up to support vulnerable people in Kent who need urgent help, supplies or medication.



The helpline – called **Kent Together** - provides a single, convenient point of contact for anyone in the county who is in urgent need of help during the Coronavirus outbreak. It is a collaboration between KCC, central Government, District, Borough and local councils, the voluntary and community sector, the NHS and other partners to ensure help is at hand for vulnerable people. It is also the place to report your concerns about the welfare of someone else.

"We now need to make sure that these vital resources are directed to where they are most needed. The new central helpline will link to Community Hubs across the county and ensure that we are effectively working hand in hand with the amazing teams out in the heart of communities in every part of Kent."

Kent Together is being coordinated by Kent County Council which will feed the information through the network of volunteers, district and borough council teams and local support groups, to ensure people get the support they need, when they need it.

People's needs will be assessed and staff will liaise with Community Hubs in the districts to prioritise those who need urgent help.

Mr Gough added: "At this unprecedented time, we all need to support each other to cope with the changes to our lifestyles we've had to make in order to delay the spread of Covid-19.

Yet Another Scam

As it is that time of year when we have just had the end of the Tax year, please be aware that scammers are busy. If you receive any messages like below impersonating HMRC promising a refund and that you need to click on a link, it is a scam. HMRC would never ask you to respond in this way and ask for personal details via a link

Remember the **ABC** of scam protection and do not **A**SSUME or **B**ELIEVE anything you receive via email, text, telephone is genuine, always **C**ONFIRM by contacting a trusted source, Bank, Police, family or friend.

Never click on links or divulge personal data or account details when receiving an out of the blue message like the one opposite.



If it seems "Too good to be true", then it probably is.

Kent PCs Note on the Above Scam

The scam above is an interesting example. If you ignore the message and just look at the link (the underlined blue text). That is an example of a website address pretending to be for HMRC. Website addresses work in a similar way to a normal house address except each bit is separated with the full stop (dot). You read the address backwards. So it starts .com that means worldwide not just UK. The actual domain, the paid for bit that is registered, is the next bit signin-uk. The rest (hmrc.gov) are just made up and called sub domains and can be anything the scammers want because those bits are ignored by the internet. A bit like the name of the person on a house address. Useful for the people in the house but ignored by the postal service. So if you read it like that it becomes obvious that it is a scam because it come from signin-uk.com not a gov.uk domain. All UK government websites end .gov.uk HMRC is

www.tax.service.gov.uk or just www.gov.uk with a forward slash to the relevant department eg /pay-paye-tax or /check-mot-status



Funding for the voluntary and community sector

The voluntary and community sector (VĆS) is proving well placed to provide and mobilise localised and neighbourhood support as the coronavirus spreads. These established groups are counting the financial impact of the measures swiftly put in place to contain the spread of the virus. They are becoming vulnerable due to:

- A loss of vital income because of closure of facilities, for example, the loss of hire fees, retail income from bars and social events and membership fees
- A reduction in donations and volunteers
- Small reserves that may not be sufficient to support them through the crisis.

Stay At Home To Stop Coronavirus Spreading

Everyone must stay at home to help stop the spread of coronavirus. For more detailed Information please go to:

www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19

You should only leave the house for 1 of 4 reasons:

- Shopping for basic necessities, for example food and medicine, which must be as infrequent as possible
- One form of exercise a day, for example a run, walk, or cycle alone or with members of your household
- Any medical need, or to provide care or to help a vulnerable person
- Travelling to & from work but only where this absolutely cannot be done from home

Important - These 4 reasons are exceptions – even when doing these activities, you should be minimising time spent outside of the home and ensuring you are 2 metres apart from anyone outside of your household.

Staying at home if you're at high risk of getting seriously ill from coronavirus

Do

- Stay at home at all times do not leave to buy food, collect medicine or exercise
- Stay 2 mtrs (3 steps) away from other people in your home as much as possible
- Get food and medicine delivered and left outside your door ask friends and family to help or register to get coronavirus support on GOV.UK if you need it
- Prepare a hospital bag, including a list of the medicines you're taking in case you need to go into hospital
- Wash your hands with soap and water often do this for at least 20 seconds
- Make sure anyone who comes into your home washes their hands with soap and water for 20 seconds
- Use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- Clean objects and surfaces you touch often (like door handles, kettles and phones) using your regular cleaning products
- Clean a shared bathroom each time you use it, for example by wiping the surfaces you have touched

Don't

- do not have visitors in your home, including friends and family, unless they're providing essential care
- do not stop taking any prescription medicines without speaking to your doctor

Staying at home if you or someone you live with has symptoms of coronavirus

How long to self-isolate

If you have symptoms of coronavirus, you'll need to self-isolate for 7 days.

After 7 days:

- if you do not have a high temperature, you do not need to self-isolate
- if you still have a high temperature, keep self-isolating until your temperature returns to normal

You do not need to self-isolate if you just have a cough after 7 days. A cough can last for several weeks after the infection has gone.

If you live with someone who has symptoms

If you live with someone who has symptoms, you'll need to self-isolate for 14 days from the day their symptoms started. This is because it can take 14 days for symptoms to appear.

If more than 1 person at home has symptoms, self-isolate for 14 days from the day the first person started having symptoms.

If you get symptoms, self-isolate for 7 days from when your symptoms start, even if it means you're self-isolating for longer than 14 days.

If you do not get symptoms, you can stop self-isolating after 14 days.

Symptoms and what to do

Do not leave your home if you have either:

- A high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- A new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3
 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be
 worse than usual)

To protect others, do not go to places like a GP surgery, pharmacy or hospital.

Stay at home.

Use the 111 online coronavirus service to find out what to do. Only call 111 if you cannot get help online.

Get an isolation note

Use this service if you have been told to self-isolate because of coronavirus and you need a note for your employer.


This service is only for people who:

- have symptoms of coronavirus
- · live with someone who has symptoms of coronavirus

If you have symptoms of coronavirus, the first thing you need to do is get health advice. If you have not already done this, use the 111 online coronavirus service

If you have to stay at home but feel well enough to work, ask your employer if you can work from home. If you can work from home, you will not need an isolation note

You can also use this service for someone else.

Ashford Mediation Service Is Open for Business

The Ashford Mediation Service remains open and available to help the people of Ashford with any conflicts that they may be experiencing.



If anything, tempers are already short and living in such close proximity to others can create situations where conflict arises either between adults in the same household; a parent & child; neighbours or family members living apart.

During these uncertain times, we know that life does not 'stop' just because we face an unpredictable virus and our government has firmly requested that we stay home where possible and practice social distancing when we are out and about.

Normally in mediation, we would work with both parties in conflict in a face-to-face manner using two of our mediators to help both parties come to a mutually satisfying outcome and agreement.

However, with COVID 19, we are following government guidelines for the health and safety of our mediators and our clients, so at this time, although we are not offering face-to-face meetings, we can offer some helpful alternatives.

Contact us Monday -Thursday from 09.30 -14.30 via mobile: **07845 914838** or by email: info@ashfordmediation.co.uk and our team will get back to you within 24 hours to find out what problems you have identified with members of the community.

Given the information you share with us, we can offer the community the following:

- 1. We can have our trained mediators' contact you by your preferred method to discuss your issues and to offer some guidance and helpful hints on how you, as an individual, might be able to resolve the situation yourself.
- 2. We can have our trained mediators contact you by your preferred method and we can also get another mediator to contact the other party with whom you are in dispute, to offer initially, individual consultations over the phone, or video conferencing (Skype, MS Teams, etc). Depending on the outcome of these initial consultations and if both parties agree, we might suggest a group video meeting to further discussions. Of course, face-to-face meetings are preferable, but much can be accomplished through facilitated conversations. If a group video conference meeting is not suitable for any reason, we can schedule this when CV19 restrictions are lifted and we can resume normal face-to-face sessions.
- 3. We can also offer a 'Keep In Touch' Service whereby if you prefer a face-to-face meeting when the travel restrictions & social distancing restrictions are lifted, we can tentatively schedule this in, for say 3 month's time, but in the meantime, we can have a trained mediator offer a 'listening' ear and some coping mechanisms on a weekly basis through a call or a video meeting if that's more suitable.



Important message from the Practice Manager of Charing Surgery

May I start though, with some requests: We do not have enough Personal Protection Equipment as supplies are not coming from NHS England. If anyone has any masks, gowns, gloves or scrubs to spare we would be very grateful. Please email charingsurgery@nhs.net and we can arrange drop off or collection with you.

Please do not collect your prescription early. People collecting repeat prescriptions only one or two weeks after receiving the previous one. This is causing unnecessary long queues as there is no shortage of medication.

Having a patient's mobile number is extremely helpful for sending out updates/changes/new information or guidance and to set up video calls. If you are over 18 and we do not have your mobile please email it to charingsurgery@nhs.net.

Surgery

Our opening hours are unchanged – 8am to 6.30pm. The surgery is operating as normal. GPs are now doing lots of video calls with patients so they can avoid coming into the surgery. However, if a GP feels they need to see a patients they will arrange that. Protective measures are in place to protect both the GP and patient.

We are ensuring those patients needing urgent diagnostics (ultrasound, blood test and echocardiogram) can be seen at the surgery. Nurses are still running warfarin, complex dressings, baby and pre-school immunisation clinics. Those appointments may be in the isolation room if appropriate. Nurses are also seeing patients in the garden and in their cars if appropriate.

We are only opening the doors to the surgery at certain times for pre-booked appointments and to allow for patient screening. We have an 8am - 9am session for vulnerable/at risk patients, 10am - 12pm and 3pm - 5pm for other appointments.

We have introduced 'e-consultations' – patients can complete a consultation on line via our website. That will be reviewed by a GP by the end of the next working day. Pictures (eg of rashes) can be attached to the e-consult. This can be very effective for non-urgent gueries.

Our GPs now have laptops so that they can work from home with access to patient's records. A number of our admin staff are also able to work remotely.

Pharmacy

The pharmacy is being overwhelmed by patients coming to collect repeat prescriptions early. By patients coming back early, it means the team cannot use the normal dispensing schedule and that leads to delays. We completely understand people are worried about running out of medication, but there is no need to be.

We are also working with volunteers to have medication delivered to vulnerable and high risk patients. There are 5 deliveries a day going out and we are looking to increase that. We have reduced the pharmacy's opening hours to allow time to prepare deliveries and keep on top of dispensing. The pharmacy opening hours are **9am to 12pm** and **2pm to 5pm**, **plus 9am to 1pm on Saturdays**.

To help with the increase in demand we are bringing in extra staff – including A Level / University students to help get the prescriptions processed as quickly as possible. For the latest updates, please see our website www.charingpractice.co.uk



All in the month of May

200 years ago, 11th May 1820 British Royal Navy sloop HMS Beagle was launched. This ship took Charles Darwin on his scientific voyage around the world (1831-36).

200 years ago: 12th May 1820 Florence Nightingale was born. This Italian-born British social reformer and statistician became the founder of modern nursing.

175 years ago: 12th May 1845 that Gabriel Faure, the French composer was born.

125 years ago: 20th May 1895 that R J Mitchell was born. This British aeronautical engineer designed the iconic Supermarine Spitfire fighter plane.

100 years ago: 17th May 1920 that the Dutch national airline KLM's first flight took place, from London to Amsterdam. Scheduled services began in 1921.

90 years ago, 24th May 1930 that British aviator Amy Johnson became the first woman to fly solo from England to Australia.

80 years ago, 2nd May 1940 Olympic Games, Tokyo, Japan, cancelled, due to WWII.

80 years ago, 1940: WORLD WAR II

- 10th May: Prime Minister Neville Chamberlain resigned after losing the support of many Conservatives in the House of Commons. Succeeded by Winston Churchill.
- 10th May: Germany dropped first bombs on England, at Chilham & Petham, Kent.
- 13th May: Winston Churchill gave his first speech in the House of Commons, saying: "I have nothing to offer but blood, toil, tears and sweat."
- 14th May: The Home Guard established, nicknamed Dad's Army it was made up of volunteers who were ineligible for military service, usually because of their age.
- 26th May-4th June: The Battle of Dunkirk. Allied forces launched a massive evacuation of troops from Dunkirk, France, across the English Channel. Nearly 340,000 soldiers were rescued in a hastily assembled fleet of 800 boats.

75 years ago, 1945: WORLD WAR II

- 2nd May: The Battle of Berlin ended. Allied victory which led to the surrender of all German forces by 8th/9th May, and the end of the war in Europe.
- 8th May: VE Day (Victory in Europe) celebrated as a public holiday.
- 28th May: British-born Nazi propaganda broadcaster Lord Haw-Haw (William Joyce) was captured by the British Army and taken to Britain to face trial. (He was convicted of treason on 19th September and hanged on 3rd January 1946.)





Keeping A Safety Net Around Children In Kent

Kent Police are urging parents to look out for signs of online grooming as children and young people in Kent spend more time at home.

The Covid-19 worldwide pandemic means that children who would normally be visiting friends and family or attending school around the county are now in lockdown and may be searching for things to do to keep them occupied.

With more people on the internet, Kent Police are reminding everyone of the steps that can be taken to keep young and vulnerable people protected from online abuse.

It is important that children using mobile phones, tablets and computers know what is right and what is wrong especially when using instant messaging services. They should only ever be speaking to people they know personally and report anything suspicious to their parents or the police.

Check what restrictions are in place, most devices will have parental controls available. Ask your child to be honest with you about their passwords and profiles.

Parents should talk about the risks when uploading and sharing private information as you can never be sure whose hands it will end up in or who can see it.

DCS Pritchard said: "We have invested in educating young people about online dangers and the chances of a real child meeting someone they've met online and becoming a victim of this sort of offence is extremely low."

"Rest assured the force has specialist detectives who are trained to work in this field and have the skills and resources needed to carry out investigations in the most appropriate way."

"It is important we all continue to do our bit to keep children safe, not just at this unprecedented time but always."

Further advice

- Speak to your children. Understand the capabilities of the devices they use, and the websites that they use.
- ♦ Keep the computer in a communal room. Explain to them the dangers of talking to strangers; whether that be in 'real life' or on the internet.
- ♦ It's important that online privacy settings are checked regularly especially when updating apps the same applies for location settings too.
- Encourage the use of strong passwords such as three or more random words or capital letters, numbers and symbols.
- Stranger danger' is as relevant on the internet as it is on the streets. You should not speak to strangers and we encourage children to raise any concerns with their parents.
- Only speak to people you know and have met. Don't accept social media requests from people you don't know.





What does Google know about me? Part II

Last month we looked at the information google keeps on you when you search on Google or use any google products. This month we will look at what we can do about limiting the amount of data they hold. You can check out all the recordings on your Google activity page. https://myactivity.google.com/myactivity You will need a google sign in to access the data

Once you log into my activity you can delete all the search history, searches, locations, interests. They've recorded it all. Deleting your Google search history will prevent it from being used by the highest bidder on the millions of sites and apps that use Google's advertising networks. To delete the results you can click on the dots on the top-right hand of the page and select "Delete activity by..." then, select "All time" and hit delete.

Basically, Google tries to track too much. It's creepy and simply just more information than one company should have on anyone.

Thankfully, there are many good ways to reduce your Google footprint, even close to zero! If you are ready to live without Google, here is how to live without Google, alternatives that protect your privacy.

Google Search = DuckDuckGo (free)

Switching to DuckDuckGo not only keeps your searches private but also gives you extra advantages such as knowing you're not trapped in a filter bubble.

Gmail, Calendar & Contacts

FastMail is an independent, paid service that also includes calendar and contacts support across all devices. Even more private email alternatives are ProtonMail and Tutanota, both of which offer end-to-end encryption by default.

Google Drive = Sync (free with paid options) <u>www.sync.com</u>


Sync provides end-to-end encryption and is very reasonably priced. You can have 5Gb free and it is completely encrypted. Only you can access the data. This is the cloud storage I use at Kent PCs.

Google Chrome = Safari (free), Firefox (free), Brave (free), Vivaldi (free)
A more cross-device compatible browser is Mozilla's Firefox, an open source
browser with a built-in tracker blocker in private mode. Brave goes one step further
with tracker blocking switched on by default.

Google Hangouts/Meet = Jami (free), Apple FaceTime (free), Microsoft Teams (free with paid option)

Jami is a cross-platform service that offers end-to-end encryption, and its privacy policy states the only data it collects is "anonymous and aggregated data for the analysis of Jami website visits statistics." If everyone involved has access to an Apple device, FaceTime is another alternative that is easy-to-use and supports end-to-end encryption. For enterprise-level support, Microsoft Teams is widely used and they note that they do not to use your Teams data to serve ads.


